Individual schools, colleges and centres will set their own criteria for entry to courses and manage their own admission procedures. You must therefore apply directly to any school or college you wish to attend. Some have set closing dates for applications. If you are interested in post 16 study at a school or college in Bristol you are strongly advised to make your enquiries early in the academic year before the year you hope to start your chosen course.
